<p>Background:</p> <p>Umatilla County, along with the Cities of Pendleton and Hermiston, will be receiving funding from the opioid litigation settlements. The funding is limited to certain uses. Some of the core abatement strategies include wrap around services to individuals in recovery. County staff, along with city staff, and treatment providers, have proposed a municipal court system navigation plan to identify and help individuals to access services. CCS will employ the necessary staff, with funding from the County and the Cities. The details are included in the attached summary. Program Description:	Mental Health/Substance Abuse

Program Objectives:	Umatilla County in partnership with the City of Pendleton and the City of Hermiston will pool their resources received from opioid court settlements. The County will enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with these two jurisdictions along with Community Counseling Solutions to fund one full time employee and embed that employee into the Municipice Courts in these two cities as well as other cities in the County, yet to be determined. The purpose of the position is to identify hi risk/need clients as well as high users of Courts,emergency rooms and police contacts. The intent is to identify the substance abuse, mental health and criminongenec needs of these individuals, so as to coordinate services, eliminate barriers and facilitate access to services so as to provide intervention and ultimately less usage of these systems. Once the MOU, is completed, Community Counseling Solutions will assemble a group of representatives of the funding agencies to establish a program steering committee. That committee will ultimately shape the polices of the program as well as determine the number to be served, the frequency of Court attendance and that data measurables related.
Method(s) of Evaluation:	Methods of evaluation are yet to be determined, however in discussions to this point, those methods have included, number of clients served, number of measureable contacts made, number of cases resolved, reduction in Court/Police activity, Number of clients engaged in progamming related to mental health and/or substance abuse and stability factors related to the client (basic needs/housing/employment etc.)
