Now on this day comes the
report of R. Sargent, M. E. Foboom and Ed. Stillman
the viewers heretofore appointed at the Sept 1891 Term
of this Court to view and determine how much less
valuable the lands of Thos. J. Means would be rendered
by reason of the location of the above mentioned road
as a County Road for final hearing, the same having
been read on a previous day of this term of this Court
to wit Nov. Term 1891, and it appearing from said
report that said viewers duly met at the time & place
appointed and were duly qualified before entering
upon the discharge of their duties in this behalf, &
it further appearing from said report that the
said viewers have estimated and appraised the damages
sustained to the land of Thos. J. Means at the sum of
One hundred and twenty five (\$125) dollars.

And it also appearing to the Court that the viewers
heretofore appointed to view out and report upon
the location of the above mentioned road, duly
made their report at the Sept. Term 1891 of this Court,
and that said viewers reported favorably & recommended
the location of the same as a County Road and the field
notes and plat of survey of said road being duly on
file and certified to by the Surveyor appointed to
survey the same.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that the report of
said viewers be accepted and that the road be estab-
lished in accordance with said report and that
the report of said viewers, field notes and plat of
survey thereof be recorded as by law required upon
payment by the petitioners herein to said Thos. J.
Means or his attorney the sum of One hundred
and twenty five (\$125) dollars, as awarded him as

damages by the said viewers R. Dargent, M.E. Folsom and E.S.D. Stillman and the satisfaction of said sum having been paid to be filed with the clerk of this court, by the petitioners herein.

And that upon said satisfaction of the payment of said damages being filed as ordered, the Road Supervisor through whose District said road runs be directed to open the same for public use as a County Road.

Now on this day comes the report of the viewers heretofore appointed at the Sept. Term 1891, of this court to view out and report upon the location of the above mentioned road as a County Road for final hearing, the same having been read upon a previous day of this term of this court, to wit: the November Term of 1891 and the said viewers having reported favorably and recommend the establishing of the same as a County Road and the field notes and plats of survey being duly on file and certified to by the surveyor appointed to survey the same and there being no remonstrance or claim for damages on file against said road.

It is therefore ordered by the court that said Road be established as a County Road in accordance with said report of said viewers and that the report of said viewers, field notes and plat of survey thereof be recorded as by law required and that the Supervisor, through whose District said road runs be directed to open the same for public use as a County Road.
