

Also come the petition of D.A. Alloway praying the Court to appoint Viewers to view out and assess damages sustained to his land by reason of the location of the said proposed road, the said D.A. Alloway, claiming damages in the sum of One Hundred and Twenty Five (\$125) Dollars. John Adams also claimed damages in the amount of \$6.50. It is therefore ordered by the Court that A.L. Gordon, Calvin Masterson and J.E. Smith Jr, and they are hereby appointed Viewers to view out and estimate as to the damages sustained by the establishing of the said proposed road as a County Road to the lands of John F. Adams, L.C. Rothrock, William Blakley, and D.A. Alloway, and Genl. Bambratt, and that they report their doings to this Court at the September Term 1893 thereof, and that they meet at the Court House in Pseudleton on the 28th day of August 1893 at the hour of 8 o'clock A.M. of said day and duly qualify before entering upon the discharge of their duties in this behalf.

In the Matter of laying out &c. of Road No 418 Described as: Com at a point where the Pseudleton and Canyon City Road crosses the Section line between Sec's 9 & 16 in Tp 12R 32 E 10m. Thence running due East as nearly as practicable along the Section line between Sections 9 & 16, 10 & 15, 11 & 14, 12 & 13 to the SE Corner of SW^{1/4} of Sec 12. Thence due north as nearly as practicable to the SE Corner of SW^{1/4} of Sec 1. Thence due East on Section line between Sections 10 & 12 same Township and Range to the West line of the New Reserve. Said Road to be Sixty feet wide.

to view said proposed road, and assess the Damage if any be sustained by Homer Rambo, Charles Rambo, W.E. Burch John Daly and A.J. Sturtevant, each of whom have filed a claim for damages herein, by reason of the location and establishment of said Road, which report was filed herein on the 6th day of July 1893, and it duly appearing to the Court from said report, and the record herein that said viewers met and viewed said road within the time and in the manner, by order of this Court directed, and that they have Reported that said Claimants, Homer Rambo, Charles Rambo, W.E. Burch, John Daly, and A.J. Sturtevant, and neither of them is, or will be in, any case, injured or damaged by the laying out, location and Establishment of said road, and neither of them is entitled to any damages. It is now therefore ordered and Adjudged that the Claims of said parties, and each of them, for damages herein filed be, and the same is hereby denied and Disallowed, and it further appearing to the Court from the report of the Viewers Herbert Boylen, George Rugg, and A. Waugh, heretofore appointed by this Court to lay out locate and Survey said road, that said Road will be a public benefit and utility and greatly needed. And that no sufficient Remonstrance has been filed, against the laying out, location and establishment of the same, and that the report of said last named Viewers has been heretofore at the May Term, 1893 of this Court Publicly read, on two different days of said term, and that a proper petition has been filed herein, together with proper and sufficient proof of the due posting of notice of the presentation of such petition, and that said road has been legally, regularly, and properly laid out, located and established.

It is now therefore further ordered that the Report of said last named viewers, together with the Surveyors plat of said road be recorded in the proper records, and the road Supervisor of the road District in which said Road is

located, is hereby ordered and directed to open the same forthwith, and said road shall hereafter be, and is hereby declared to be a Public Highway.

And there coming no further Business before the Court, and the Journal having been read, approved and signed, whereupon Court Adjourned until Tuesday Morning July 11th 1893 at 9 Am.
