All persons interested are hereby notified that a petition will be presented to the Honorable County Court of Umatilla County, State of Oregon, at the next regular term thereof for the location of a County road in said County and State as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the town of Umatilla City in said County and running thence in a southerly and south-westerly course along the Umatilla River on the east side thereof on the most practicable ground to the "Four Mile House," thence in a south westerly direction following along the course of the now travelled road on the most practicable ground to the lower bridge of the Umatilla River at or near the mouth of Butter Creek, thence in the same course or direction on the east side of said Butter Creek on the most practicable ground until said road strikes said Butter Creek at the point where the north line of M. Baxter's preemption land claim in Township 2 N. R. 27 E. crosses said Butter Creek, thence crossing said Butter Creek and continuing in the same general direction following the course of the old road across a ridge on the most practicable ground until said road strikes Little Butter Creek at the junction of the old road above mentioned at Thomas Scott's place with said Little Butter Creek, thence as follows

on the most practicable ground miles
said road strikes Little Butter Creek
at the junction of the old road above
mentioned at Thomas Scott's place with
said Little Butter Creek, thence follow-
ing up the course of the said Little
Butter Creek on the most practicable
route to the saw-mill at the head of
said Little Butter Creek known as
W. H. Colton's saw-mill,

above mentioned being one terminus of
said proposed road herein petitioned
for and the said saw mill above-
mentioned being the other terminus of
said proposed road-
