Found a 2 1/2" galvanized iron pipe with with 2 1/2" brass cap, 24" above ground and in a 3' diam. collar of stone.

DESCRIPTION OF MONUMENT AND ACCESSORIES I ESTABLISHED TO PERPETUATE THE ORIGINAL LOCATION OF THIS CORNER:

At the base of the iron pipe I rebuild the 3' diam. mound of stone, from which:

NEW BEARING OBJECTS:

A 4' x 4' stone face bears South 52° East, a dist. of 7.30 feet, marked X BO A 2' x 2' stone face in 60' long rock bluff bears South 62° West, a dist. of 3.15 feet, marked X BO


