The Deputy Surveyors notes state "Set a Basalt Stone 18x10x8 ins., marked ¼ on the W. face with a mound of stone over it". U.S. Indian Services Surveyor, C.E. Redfield found the Original monument in 1919 and set an Iron Post in its place.
