General Description.

There are no settlers, as yet, in this Tp. The lands are high, & to the N. broken, to the S. rolling. There is much the sameness throughout the Tp.

The soil uniformly of good 2nd rate, sustaining a fine growth of grass, affording excellent range for stock. Persons engaged in teaming and packing to the mines, many of them bring their stock into this and adjoining Tps. to winter, the grass being excellent and the lands sufficiently rolling to give considerable surface to the Southern hillsides, where the heat of the sun soon melts the snow and leaves the grass uncovered, thus making it one of the best winter ranges in E. Oregon.

For summer pasturage, there is a scarcity of water, which operates against the permanent settlement of the lands, but the difficulty will in time be overcome by sinking wells and this county will soon be well settled.
