Chains

- 43.00 Leave belt of timber.
- 52.25 Enter dense undergrowth, brs. N. & S.
- 53.84 Bottom of deep gorge, course S.
Enter timber.
- 54.14 Dry bed of stream, 10 lks. wide, (water below line), course
South.
Ascend steep, stony hill, brs. N. & S.
- 60.00 Leave timber & undergrowth, brs. N. & S.
- 79.00 Top of rise, a rocky ridge-point, brs. S.30° W.
Descend gradually along rocky hillside.
- 82.34 A point, 100 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. Cor. and Cor. of Secs. 17,
18, 19 & 20.
Land; mountainous.
Soil; gravelly & stony, 3rd & 4th rates.
Scattered timber; pine, fir, spruce & tamarack.
Undergrowth; chaparral, fir, pine, spruce, tamarack, alder,
willow & bunch grass.
Mountainous land; 82.34 chs.

2.50 More gradual ascent through heavy timber, brs. with hill.

8.50 Summit, brs. E. & W.

Thence over rolling land.

20.00 Wood road, brs. E. & W.

20.83 A spruce, 20 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on
N. & S. sides.35.45 A fir, 20 ins. diam., on line, I mark with 2 notches on N.
and S. sides.35.55 Middle of wagon road from settler's place to Walla Walla,
brs. E. & W.

Descend gradually.
