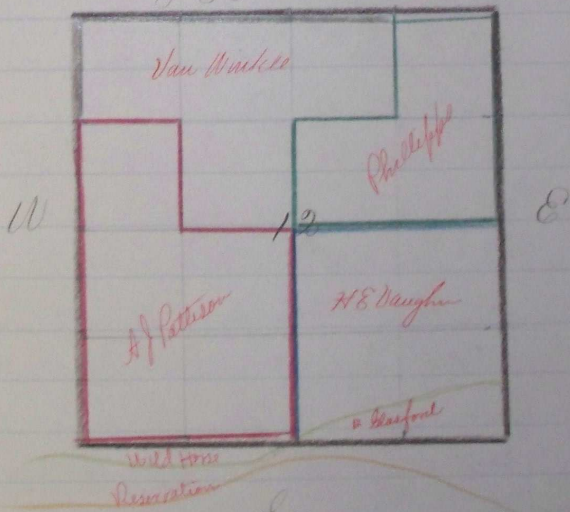

A point 18 links East of post in mound of rock same being  $\frac{1}{4}$  U.S. Gov post set in original survey. This post is 3 chains East of confluence of N+S forks of Mill Horse Creek

From above survey and by mutual consent of parties interested I establish a corner for the center of Sec 12 at a point where the two cross lines bisect each other, by burying a flat whiskey flask 8 inches deep and setting a basalt rock 10x12x15 over it. And for the N.W. cor of the N.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  I plant a square bottle and a basalt stone 10x11x13
