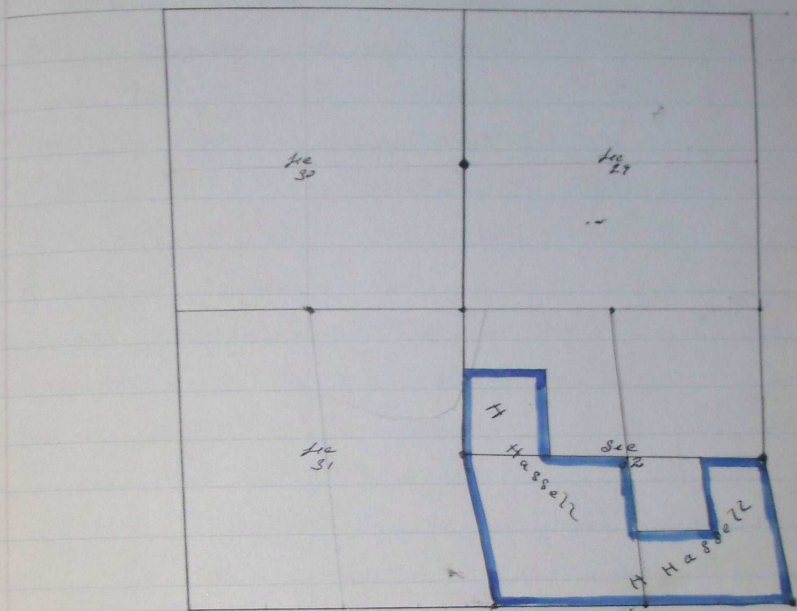


Roman Hassell

July 1st 1897



I commenced at the corner to Sec 31 & 32 on township line between T 3 & 4 N R 36 E 100m which is the original corner as described in Government Field Notes. Thence run North on random line $\text{Var } 21^\circ \text{ E}$ descend steep hillside 18 50 cross line or it was crest -
 40 00 could find no $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner
 56 00 bearing course S E
 73 76 to Rail Fence course S 8 W as there is no indication of the corner in vicinity I set stake at intersection of fence and proceed to the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner bet Sec 29 & 30 and run North on random line bet Sec 29 & 30 and at 38 50 chains I placed same fence running S 8 W 754.160 crest of North end of First line run North from corner to Sec 31 & 32. This being very unsatisfactory I proceed to the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner bet Sec 30 & 31 and run East on random

Witnessed 55 lbs East of the original corner to Sec 4-6-32 1833 on Spruce as described in U.S. Field notes
~~As~~ I cannot find any person that has ever saw the corner to Sec 29-30-31 1832, but it is said that Wm Kilgore at one time owned the N 8 1/4 Sec 31 I said for him and on the 8th day of July he years on the ground and says he will have nothing to say as to the corner to Sec 29-30-31 1832 which was his N 6 corner when he owned the N 8 1/4 Sec 31 but that he could show me the 1/4 Sec corner bet Sec 31 1832 as he had saw it - and noted locality so I administered to him the following oath

I Wm Kilgore first being duly sworn depose and say that the evidence to be given as regards the original locality of the 1/4 Sec. corner between Sec 31 1832 - in Township 4 North Range 36 East Will. Mer. Oregon shall be true to the best of my knowledge and belief
 Signed Wm Kilgore

Subscribed and sworn to before me this the 8th day of July 1877
 John W. Kimbell County Surveyor
 Present Beay Kimbell and L. M. Smith Chairman and John Lee Ferguson and G. Russell owner of land in Sec 30
 after which we proceed to the place indicated by Wm Kilgore where we find logs and the ground a stone marked 1/4 and pointed out by said Kilgore as at or very near place which he had saw it - years before, this point being or nearly in conformity with the line ^{at corner} North and East as I had found them I accept the point and set the stone in the ground and built a stone mound around it - and run north bet Sec 31 1832

38 24 to a point Equal distant bet 1/4 Sec cor between Sec 29 1832 and 30 1831 as per U.S. Field Notes also - Equidistant -
