I started at the N.E. corner of Sec. 36 which is a stone in a mound of stone. from this corner I run South at 20 chains set Stake for temporary $\frac{1}{2}$ corner at 405¹/₂ chains set Stake for temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ sec corner and 8104 chains the S.E. corner Sec 36 which is also the S.E. corner to S. 7th E. 8th R. 45th 46th Edwth. from which I run North our True line and at 4052 chains I move Stake for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec corner and at 6078 chains planted a Stake and built mound of stones from which a Pine 34 inches diameter bears N $64^{\circ} 45' W$ 75 links distant a Pine 14 inches diameter bears S. $15^{\circ} W.$ 67 links distant

I then started at the S.E. corner of Sec. 36 and run west Var 89° 30' E and at 20 chains set stake for $\frac{1}{16}$ corner and at 40 chains set Stake for temporary $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner and at 8086 chains the S.W. corner of Sec 36 from which I run East on true line and at 4018 chains marked Stone and Planted in small creek or irrigation ditch in mound of stone from which a Cottonwood or Balm 6 inches bears $86^{\circ} 30' E$ 28 links distant, and at 6027 chains planted stakes for $\frac{1}{16}$ corner. from which I run North and at 4076 $\frac{1}{16}$ come. I then started at $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec corner on East side of Sec 36 from which I run West at 2044 chains the $\frac{1}{16}$ come previously set and at 4084 chains the center of Sec 36 by Alineament from $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. to $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner through the center East & West and North & South as per instructions from the Hon. Commissioner, as the corners was in sight I did not think it necessary to chain the whole distance, from this come or center I run North at 20 chains set Stake for temporary $\frac{1}{16}$ come and at 4052 chains the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. come on North side of Sec 36. from which I run South on true line and at 2026 drove Stake and built mound of Rock for $\frac{1}{16}$ corner.

I started at N.W. corner of Sec. 6, from which I run South bearing $20^{\circ} E$ at 20 chains set Stake for Surveyor's $\frac{1}{4}$ corner at 4052 chains the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner on west side of Sec. 6, from which I run North on trail line and at 2026 chains planted a Stake $6 \times 6 \times 12$ inches from which a Pine Tree 12 inch diameter bears $S 14^{\circ} W$ 5^{56} links distant a Pine tree 14 inches diameter bears $N 52^{\circ} 30' E$ 7^{77} links dist.
